Unnamed Stream in a remote part of the Cascade Mountains of Oregon

I just returned from spending 2 weeks in Oregon and although I don't mean to be a Travel Ambassador for the state of Oregon, I certainly could be. I've photographed in Oregon before and quickly learned I wanted to return. Oregon has it all - - hundreds of miles of some of the thickest and plushest forests you'll ever see, abundant rivers, lakes and waterfalls, 363 miles of Pacific Ocean coastline and even some desert. This Newsletter and my next (12/1/13) will be devoted to this trip.

Depending upon your source of information, Oregon is often referred to as the state with the largest number of waterfalls. Many are named and famous. Hundreds are unnamed. You simply can't spend much time without seeing or being near a waterfall. The geologic history of Oregon has led to literally

thousands of waterfalls. The volcano dominated Cascade Mountains consist of 13 major mountains that are the result of former volcanoes. According to the gurus, whenever you have this kind of geology resulting in many dominant peaks, many waterfalls are sure to follow. And of course, where you have waterfalls, there must be a spring, stream or river.

Due to Oregon's many streams, rivers and waterfalls, my photographic emphasis was to capture these scenes with touches of autumn color. I've selected two (2) for this month's Featured Photographs.
