

Sunset on Worster Lake, Potato Creek State Park, Indiana

During summer, the climate is comfortable, people are out and about and everyone observes the day's sunset, but how many people observe sunsets in the winter? After all, winters can be uncomfortable for some and many hibernate until warmer weather. However, sunsets in the winter are often every bit as spectacular as the summer.

This past January, in Northern Indiana, Mother Nature put a string of days together when the sunsets were extraordinary. On at least one of those evenings, the sunset was as colorful as any sunset I had ever witnessed. I was fortunate to capture that spectacular sunset and display it above as one of my "Featured Photographs". The scene is Worster Lake located within Potato Creek State Park. Except for my wife, no one else was there to see the sunset from our perspective.

On the evening before this, the sky looking to the Northeast was also terrific with brilliant magenta colors above one of the frozen wetlands, also within Potato Creek State Park. This is my second "Featured Photograph" shown below.

As I've done here, we frequently call these photographs of sunsets. In reality, we're referring to the entire period of time from when the sun starts setting until darkness occurs. Sunset is defined as the moment when the trailing edge of the sun disappears below the horizon. Most of the colorful skies occur after sunset and before dusk. This period is called twilight and both photographs here were taken during twilight.

Even if you don't want to weather the elements, driving to somewhere special and observing a winter sunset can be uplifting and good medicine for the winter blahs. You may also find that you're the only one observing that special moment.

Potato Creek State Park is located in Northern Indiana. The entrance

to the park is on State Rd 4 approximately 6 miles west of U.S. 31.
